


Almost every business leader has heard of Generative AI, but very few have a lot of knowledge

How do you intend on implementing Gen Al into your business?




Gen AI is being used by a third of mid-market businesses, but few have effectively operationalised it

What would be the top 3 ways you could see your business using Generative Al?





Overall businesses see largely positive impacts from Generative Al



To what extent do you agree or disagree? % that agree (4) or strongly agree (5)




Businesses agree that Gen AI will impact a range of business operations, requiring many to **upskill and/or pivot resources**



Assessing the use case: What works?

Anything that has standard components that fit within a bigger Repetitive work piece of work — agendas, meetings, briefing notes, summaries Anything that is shifting content or information from one format to Repurposed work another — a report to a summary to an email to a structured table to some social posts Anything your business does where there is a standard operating **Templated work** procedure or one or two 'right ways' to do things — structured tables, regular reports. Anything you would like to do if you could but you never have the Would-if-I-could work time or resources — scenario planning, videos, more engaging content, personalised marketing, or better design





What doesn't work?

- Tasks that rely on maths, facts, or delivering the same result every time without fail.
- GenAl struggles with some things that should seem simple — it isn't a calculator, Google or Wikipedia.

- Tasks that are only meaningful when a human does them.
- GenAl shouldn't be providing emotional support, write love letters, be used to convey distressing news or make difficult, risky decisions.



Addressing disruption

- It challenges the way we market businesses
- It redefines human-to-machine communication
- It breaks down traditional silos for knowledge and skills
- It can address glaring resource challenges including in human services
- It works without complaint and has the scope for self improvement

You can save hours by knowing what to ask, in what order, and the kind of output you are looking for

You *don't* need domain knowledge to create great output

You do need domain knowledge to sense check the final product but

Over time, you *can build* a new kind of knowledge based on testing and refining GPT's work



Good governance

- Set guidelines for what is and isn't appropriate for Al
- Skill up your teams so they can use AI safely and responsibly
- Expect hallucination and have checks in place
- Never use confidential material or private data
- Start small with low-risk cases and share lessons
- Continue to build your governance framework over time



Avoiding the 'secret cyborg'

- Banning GPT can push it underground
- People will still use it, but they won't seek advice or help
- The risks increase as you have no capacity to identify how much is human, and how much is GPT

GPT has my entire company believing I am a wizard

Other

I'm sure there are thousands of posts like this but I needed to tell someone lol. I'm relatively new to a company in a data analyst role. I have been using it regularly to address data issues, quality improvement, and pretty much everything else being thrown at me. It is to the point where every single person in leadership (including the CEO) refers to me as "The wiz."

On one hand it feels so amazing to feel so valued at work, on the other hand I feel a bit ashamed by not telling them how I do it. I'm not dishonest with them, I always tell them I'm just resourceful. My fear is that eventually I'll be "exposed" and thought of as a cheater.

It has gotten so nuts that our contracts department obtained some new obscure software that they were struggling to use so the CEO advised them that they need to get with me because I'd probably be able to figure it out for them.
